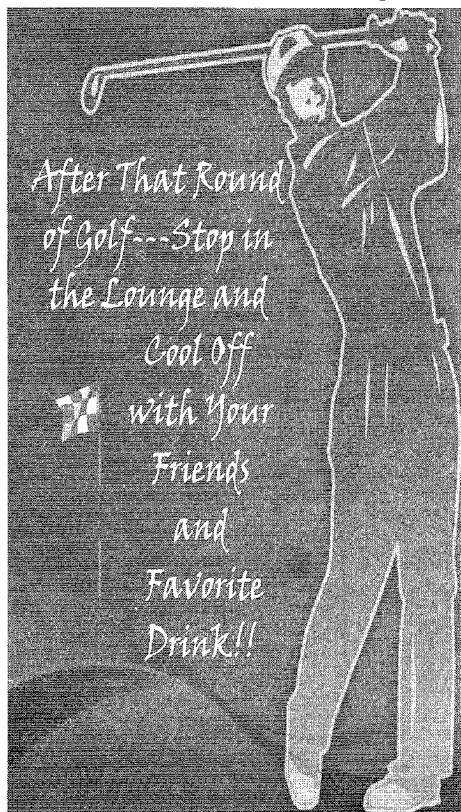

Senior Golfer Rules . . . (If Only)

Rule 1-A ball sliced or hooked into the rough shall be lifted and placed on the fairway at a point equal to the distance it carried or rolled into the rough with

no penalty. The senior should not be penalized for tall grass which ground keepers failed to mow.

may be blown in. This does not apply to balls more than three inches from the hole. No one wants to make a travesty of the game.



Enjoy The Game!!

Rule 2-A ball hitting a tree shall be deemed not to have hit the tree. This is simply bad luck and luck has no place in a scientific game. The senior player must estimate the distance the ball would have traveled if it had not hit the tree and play the ball from there.

Rule 6-There is no penalty for so-called "out of bounds." If penny-pinching golf course owners bought sufficient land, this would not occur. The senior golfer deserves an apology, not a penalty.

Rule 3-There shall be no such thing as a lost ball. The missing ball is on or near the course and will eventually be found and pocketed by someone else, making it a stolen ball. The player is not to compound the felony by charging himself or herself with a penalty.

Rule 7-There is no penalty for a ball in a water hazard, as golf balls should float. Senior golfers should not be penalized for manufacturers' shortcomings.

Rule 4-If a putt passes over a hole without dropping, it is deemed to have dropped. The law of gravity supersedes the Rules of Golf.

Rule 8- Advertisements claim that golf scores can be improved by purchasing new golf equipment. Since this is financially impractical for many senior golfers, one-half stroke per hole may be subtracted for using old equipment.

Rule 5.-Putts that stop close enough to the cup that they could be blown in,

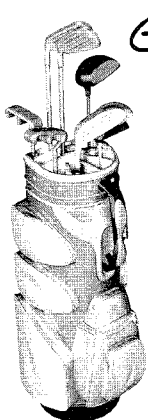


Tournament time is here; if the snow will ever quit falling!

DIRECTOR OF GOLF

By the time of this posting the spring greens aeration at both the Airport and Prairie View Golf Courses will have been completed.

We have reached a point where the soil profile of the greens, four inches deep, are now virtually 100% sand. This has been one of the primary goals of our cultural program over the years. As the soil structure of the greens changes so should our management techniques. As such we will be implementing a less intrusive program. However, by doing so, we need to proceed with caution.

The effectiveness of a less intrusive program will be judged by a number of factors, some of which are seemingly unseen. If at any time we see that this program is not effective in keeping some issues in check (wear and tear, organic matter levels low and annual bluegrass in check) we will revert back to what has proven effective and beneficial over the years.

That being said, at this time the greens at Prairie View will need to be much aerated and topdressed as we have in the past due to the dust and debris blowing in from the compost facility west of the golf course. Without pull-

ing this material out through core aeration, we will face sediment layering issues which impede drainage, and thus reduce the long term health and quality of the putting surfaces.

In short, the cultural dynamics of a golf course, especially putting greens, are always changing and with that we need to stay flexible with an eye on playability. But we have to always reserve the right to use intrusive and somewhat disruptive methods if the situation once again changes, and the need to do so arises.

Hopefully an even better golfing experience will be the end result of this approach.

on the scoreboard outside of the golf shop door. The schedule will also be posted in this publication each month and on the club website. Please check the schedule outside of the pro shop door for the latest schedule as things do change from time to time.

Entries will be taken for the Opening Day Scramble as well as the Shorty Walker beginning May 1st.

The Opening day scramble will be held on Sunday May 22nd and will be an 8.00 AM shotgun start. The cost is \$40.00 per person and make your own teams. We will be playing the dice game again this year. Golf cart, lunch, and prizes are included in the entry.

The Shorty Walker will be held on Friday, Saturday, & Sunday May 28th, 29th, & 30th. The cost will be \$65.00 per person which includes Dinner on Saturday evening, carts & prizes. The format will be a one, two & four person scramble, make your own teams. Tee times will be announced when a final play count has been determined.

May is free lesson month. We are giving free 10 minute lessons all month long so come in the golf shop and make your appointment.

The Wyoming State Golf Association is asking its members to update their address information through the handicap computer. This is why when you post a score it is asking for address and e-mail address info. We are also looking into the possibility of going paperless in regard to handicap stickers.

If you provide your e-mail address to the USGA and the WSGA, they will send you a handicap card via e-mail. Check with us in the shop for more info.

Beginning with the Opening Day scramble, the tournament pace of play policy will be as follows:

- 1.) The pace of play for all events will be 4 hours, 30 minutes or 15 minutes per hole.
- 2.) Groups will be asked to keep their starting interval during the round.
- 3.) Two stroke penalties may be assessed to the group any time after the 4 hour 30 minute period.
- 4.) Groups playing extra holes during a shotgun start or taking more than 5 hours to complete their rounds may be disqualified from the event.
- 5.) The clock will start when the horn is sounded for a shotgun start or the last player of the group hits his first tee shot from his or her starting hole during a tee time start.

We are trying to make play enjoyable for everyone and the last thing that we want to do is to hurry players around the course. However we need to make an effort to speed up play because during some of the club functions, we were just out there way too long. I believe that everyone should be able to play the course in 4 and one half hours, there is no reason to have groups out there for five or five and one half hours. We understand that things happen out there and adjustments need to be made, so these guidelines will hopefully help the speed of play issue.
